From the Director, Jane Fellows...

Stephen MacDonald has created a highly theatrical theatre piece by allowing the audience into the heart and into the mind of both Siegfried Sassoon and Wilfred Owen. These two highly individual World War I British poets are brought to life through their brief encounters with each other and through their poems and letters. Their experiences during World War I are intensely vivid and personal. The structure of the play is a memoir by Sassoon as he reflects on his private times with Owen. Wilfred Owen does not survive the last days of the war. Sassoon, in this play, discovers the way to honor his friend and fellow poet as he struggles with the loss.

When asked to direct this play, I was humbled and honored to work with the words of these extraordinary poets. I perform THE BELLE OF AMHERST, a one-woman show about Emily Dickinson. I know the power of a personal journey as the audience gets a glimpse of a life through poetry and letters. Being in the presence of the creation of a poem is a remarkable experience.

The senselessness of war and the gravity of honoring those who fought and died for a cause is a juxtaposition we should always struggle with. One hundred years after the Armistice, the questions of why so many died in order to remap Europe still remain. The bells rang out, but the bottom line was about the suffering.

A two-person play presents its own challenges and rewards. The sheer volume of lines for both actors to learn and make their own is staggering. So, developing a rehearsal schedule that helps them is essential. Kevin Yell and Dustin Fuentes have brought such an ethic to the rehearsal process. They are always prepared and so ready to take the emotional risks involved with portraying these vulnerable poets. Every night I leave the rehearsal energized by what we discovered and embraced as artists and individuals.

NOT ABOUT HEROES is relevant historically. NOT ABOUT HEROES is about a friendship that is delightful and compelling. NOT ABOUT HEROES exposes us to two poets who were not afraid to take us into the dark places of World War I. NOT ABOUT HEROES is about honor, about loss, about humanity. Bravo to New Century Players for taking on this mighty piece in their season. NOT ABOUT HEROES is a story that needs to be told......and then told again.

Kevin Yell (Siegfried Sassoon)

Kevin was born in Leicester, England and grew up around villages where every parish church, and even his school chapel, had a memorial to the dead of the Great War. Being part of this play feels like connecting to his roots. He has directed for New Century many times, (including Glorious!, Laramie Project, and Stairway to Paradise,) as well as acted in a couple of shows, (Hairspray and Love Letters.)

His first role was the Big Bad Wolf, age about 9, played in a neighbor's garage. While in the UK he enjoyed doing leads in "Panto," such as Aladdin and Dick Whittington, as well as musicals (Tommy, Brigadoon; Bobby, Company, Rooster Hannigan, Annie;) and Gilbert and Sullivan operettas.

He has written and choreographed for the stage both sides of the "pond," and NCP produced his play "Entanglement" in 2014.

On this 100th Anniversary of the Armistice, this production is dedicated to the soldiers and families who continue to pay the real price of war through their broken lives and their battered relationships. Dustin Fuentes (Wilfred Owen)

Not About Heroes marks Dustin's return to the stage after 8 years. His passion for acting began at a young age and was strongly kindled by his time in the Rex Putnam Theatre Department - where he took part in 14 productions and received the Drama Award his senior year. Getting to rehearse and perform in the Black Box has been a nostalgic experience for Dustin - it's a place that holds too many wonderful memories for him to count.



Dustin currently works for 102.9/750 The Game where he is a studio engineer for the Portland Timbers, and a sports update anchor. He is also a voice actor and can be heard on a number of commercials throughout the Portland radio market.
