From the Director...

Welcome to *The Octette Bridge Club* by P.J. Barry. Tonight you are going to experience a play written in the 1980's about women in the 1930-1940's being produced by a theatre company in the year 2019! Even though the play is older and written about a time gone by, I think it is a fine way to spend an evening in the theatre.

I chose *The Octette Bridge Club* for three reasons. First, there are eight roles for women and just one role for a man.



EIGHT roles for women!!! You do not see that very often in a play, trust me. And, the eight women are wonderfully juicy roles to play. They are a complex combination of mothers, daughters, sisters, aunts, professionals, and homemakers. They are also uniquely interesting women with their own strengths, weaknesses and dreams.

Secondly, I like plays that let us look back at how we used to live. It is easy, especially right now, to have a real fondness for a nostalgic, simpler time. *The Octette Bridge Club* is indeed a look back, but P.J. Barry doesn't shy away from tackling some tough subjects. I love how these kinds of stories let us see how we have both progressed and stayed the same. The play's themes of sisterhood, religious faith, mental health awareness, making a marriage work and finding a balance between loyalty to one's self and family are universal and still very relevant today. All the characters tonight are struggling to understand their roles in society, their duty to their families and their sense of self. Who can't relate to that?

Finally, I chose this play because I think it is entertaining. The women are funny, sweet, flawed, sad, joyous, inspiring and loving. They are a delight to spend time with. My hope is that you will laugh and cry and relate to these women like I do and just possibly relate to all the women in your life a bit better for having experienced *The Octette Bridge Club*.

tunity to be on stage with this incredible group of "sister" actors!




Wendy May Connie (Mrs. David Emerson)
